MY ROTARY EMBLEM

It grants me a great and honourable privilege. Anywhere I go, each wearer of this noble badge is my friend. Into their surroundings I may go with assurance of a warm welcome. It requires of me that I think in harmony with the principles of Rotary, the highest in the land and broad enough to encompass every daily activity. It requires that I dispel the prejudices of race, creed and political views. I must be patient, liberal, just and upright, all to a noticeable degree. It reminds me that it moves in a realm to itself. It is looked upon with unimpaired respect wherever it appears. Its wearer enjoys a distinction that only the violation of its principles can mar. All this speculation makes me wonder if I deserve to wear it. Am I equal to all it implies?



END TEXTILE WASTE

HOW CLOTHING IMPACTS CLIMATE CHANGE:

Clothes cause 35% of the microplastics in our environment. We need more awareness of the impact of synthetic clothes and what we can do about it.

WASTE CREATED BY TEXTILE:

- Global textile fibre production has almost doubled from 58 million tonnes in 2000 to 109 million tonnes in 2020, and projected to grow to 145 million tonnes by 2030.
- 50% clothes are synthetic and most are almost 'single use'.
- Less than 50% used clothes are collected for reuse and recycling, only
 1% is recycled to new clothes.

IMPACT OF TEXTILE ON OUR ENVIRONMENT

OVERCONSUMPTION OF NATURAL RESOURCES:

- We have an over-consumption of natural resources: an estimated 2,700 litres of fresh water is required to make 1 T-shirt, the same as one persons drinking needs for 2.5 year.
- Water pollution: Textile production is estimated to be responsible for 20% responsible of clean water pollution.
- Microplastics: A single laundry of polyester clothes can discharge 700,000 Micro Plastic fibres. More than half a Million Tonnes of Micro Plastics finish on the bottom of the ocean.
- Health and biodiversity: Garment production and the microplastics in the air, soil and water have a devastating impact on the health of local People, Animals and Ecosystem.
- ♦ Greenhouse gas emissions: The fashion industry is estimated to be responsible for 10% of Global Gas Emissions, more than International Flights and Maritime shipping combined.

MICROPLASTICS

- ♦ 35% microplastics come from clothes
- ♦ 28% from car tires

For Rotary:

- 1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
- 2. Set-Up
 - a) Obtain code from Ann 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery,

Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes (Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)

- c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on side table with drinks. Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
- d) To place on table with 2 kettles—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure kettles are filled, power point on, and set kettles to boil
- e) Heaters on (as required)
- f) Set up PA System
- g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
- **3.** Pack-Up (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
