ABOUT THE ROTARY CLUB OF VERVIERS:

The Rotary Club Verviers, fully committed to the Rotary diversity since 2009.

Created in 1936 by about twenty Verviers residents, the club retains all its dynamism despite the weight of

the years. It was at the origin of the formation of several clubs in the east of Belgium, from Herve to Malmedy and Eupen, not to mention the clubs of our fellow citizens, the Rotaract Verviers, a club of active and dynamic young people founded in December 1977, focused on helping children, the Rotary Club Verviers-Vesdre, created in February 1986 and Verviers in the Blue Ardennes, chartered in March 2012,

After the 2021-2022 Rotary year, deeply marked by the catastrophic floods that hit our City and the Verviers region on July 14th and 15th, 2021, our club, chaired by Marc Elsen during the year 2022-2023 and Marc Gilson the following year, has continued its support for local associations focused on social integration, children and people affected by a physical or mental disability. This year 2023-2024 was also marked by communication and the opening of the Rotary Club Verviers to people who are not familiar with Rotary's actions.

Our club remains very loyal to Rotary International's superb Youth Exchange Program (Y.E.P.). We welcomed five young people from North America, Indonesia, Australia and South America, allowing five young people from our region to spend a year discovering the other side of the Atlantic or in Oceania. The four youngsters from across the Atlantic returned to their families at the end of June, but the fifth youngster, an Australian, is continuing his exchange year with our

club until next December.


President Philippe Somja, is launching his action programme, faithful to the dynamism and desire of our club to remain attentive to the needs of our local environment.



ROTARY CATERING INFORMATION SET UP — YOUTH SERVICE TUESDAY 15TH OCTOBER

For Rotary:

- 1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
- 2. Set-Up
 - a) Obtain code from Ann 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery,

Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes (Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)

- c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on side table with drinks. Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
- d) To place on table with 2 kettles—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure kettles are filled, power point on, and set kettles to boil
- e) Heaters on (as required)
- f) Set up PA System
- g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
- **3.** Pack-Up (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
